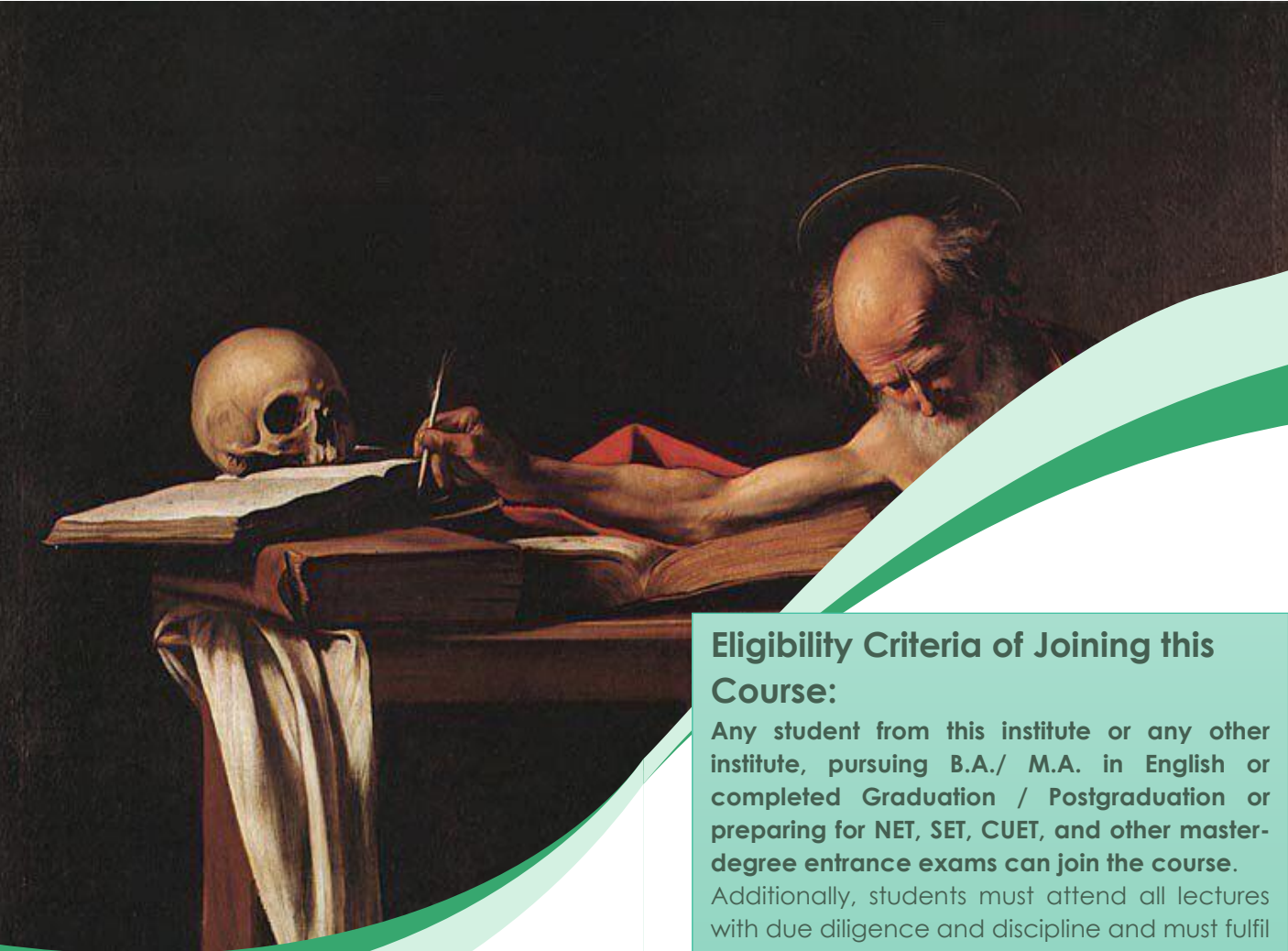


Course Objective

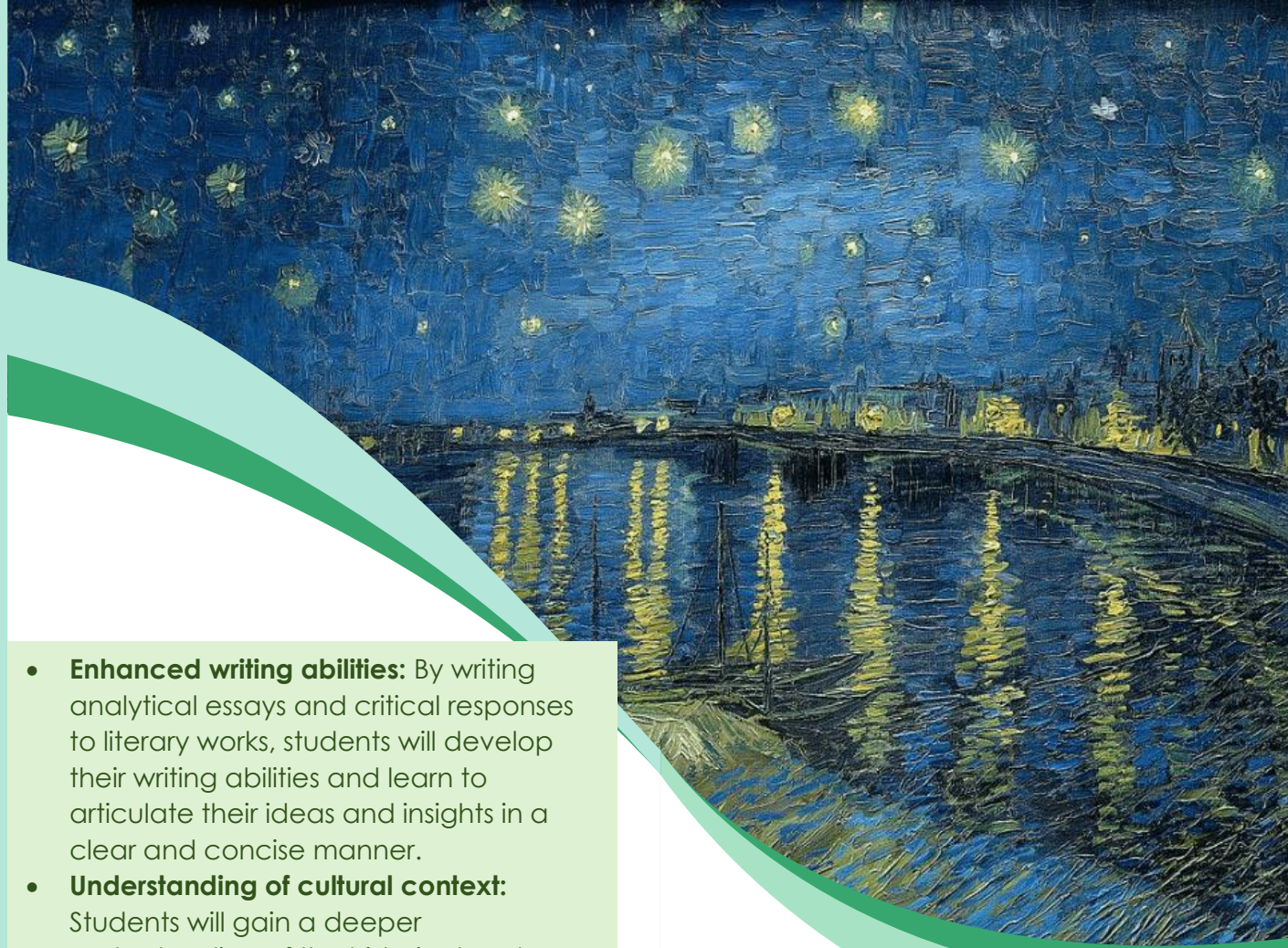


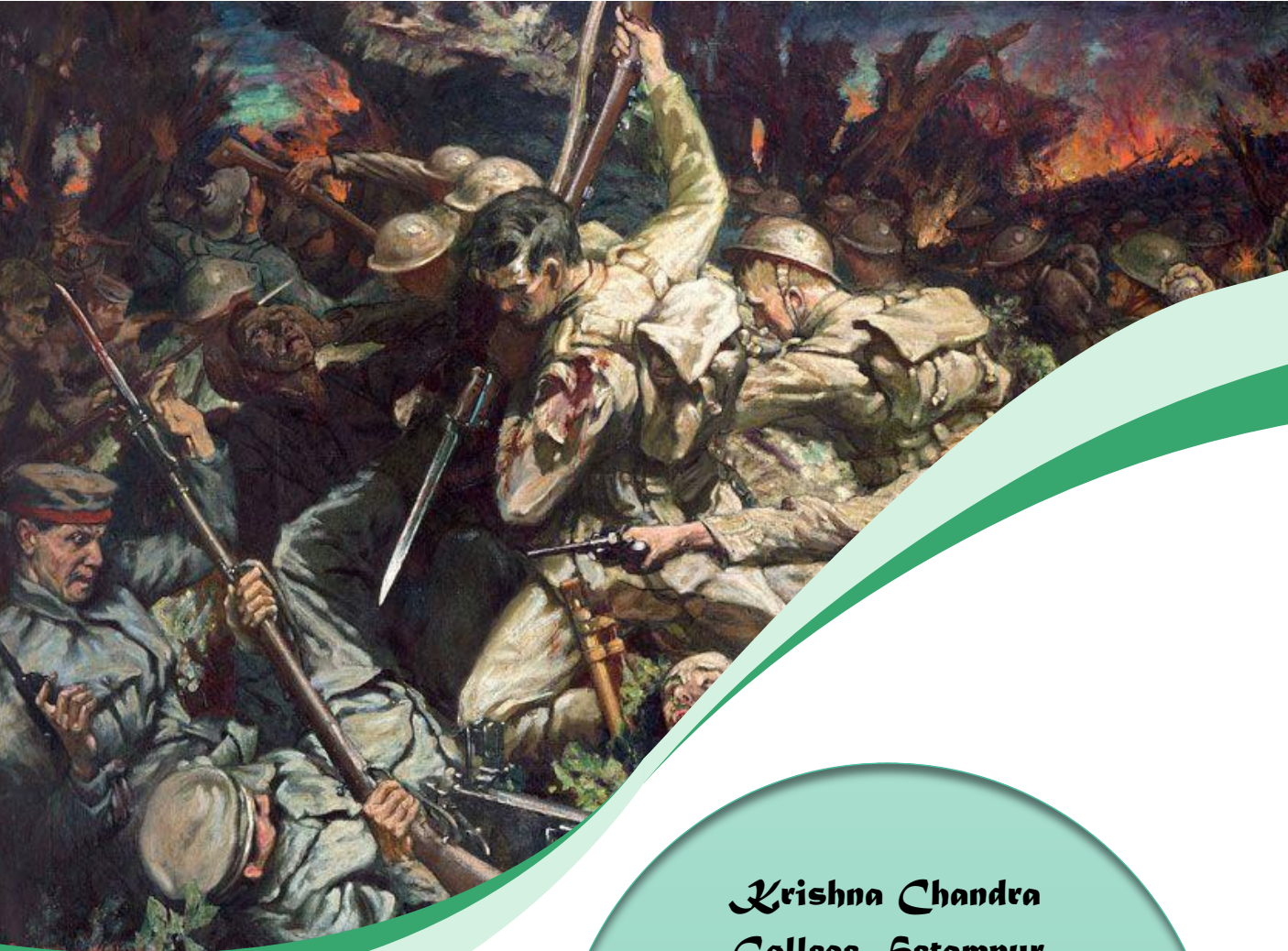
Course outcomes:
